Mayor Pro Tem Norman Baumgarden declared meeting open at 6:09 P.M.

It was moved by Alderman Bradford, second by Alderman Stone to accept & approve the agenda for tonight's meeting. Motion passed 3-0.

<u>Public Comment:</u> Julie Dierenfeldt was present to discuss her concerns with the lift station located at Francis St. On March 15th the pump failed and flooded her basement with sewage. They had to pull their carpeting out of the hallway and a bedroom. They believe there is more water than should be flowing into the lift station. There is a problem there and it needs to be addressed.

New Business:

Lift Station Pump Failure:

Doug informed the Board that on March 15th, the pump failed at the lift station located at Francis St. He contacted Alliance Pump that day and they came to inspect the electrical panel. They had to reset the amperage on one of the pumps, but they believed everything was okay after that. He will continue to monitor the lift station more frequently. The Board wanted Doug to find where the extra ground water is coming from. He needs to contact MRWA and have them help with possibly doing some smoke testing. He needs to find out how much an auto dialer is for the lift station for when the alarm goes off so that

he can be immediately notified of a pump failure. The Clerk has turned this incident in to the insurance company to see if it is covered under liability. The Board told Mrs. Dierenfeldt that the city would reimburse her for the cost of replacement materials and to give her receipts to the Clerk.

April Board Meeting:

The April board meeting needs to be moved to April 21, 2021 due to some board members being out of town.

<u> City Hall – Open Bids:</u>

The City Clerk opened the submitted bids for renovations to the old fire house for the purpose of City Hall relocating.

Swindler Construction - \$58,100 – Option A \$63,200 – Option B Ed Riley Construction - \$92,975.30 – Option A \$89,433.30 – Option B TNL Drywall & Construction \$51,530 – Option A \$62,720 – Option B

The City Clerk informed the Board that moving to a new city hall to the old fire station would be a direct violation of a court judgement from 2004, between the City and the Fire Department. The judgement states that the 1926 International Fire truck is to be housed in the old fire station.

After some discussion the Board instructed the City Clerk to have the 1926 fire truck put back in the old fire station and for the other bay to remain empty until the City can utilize it for storage.

The Board would like for the City Clerk to get a direct quote from 2 or 3 local contractors for a new, metal city hall that would replace the current city hall. This will only be for a quote just to see if we have any other options.

Ordinance #2021-01 City Budget 2021-2022:

It was moved by Alderman Stone, second by Alderman Bradford to suspend rules and move to the 2nd and 3rd/Final Reading of Ordinance #2021-01. On roll call vote, the motion carried as follows:
